We can never describe God directly – only in metaphor. The words we use for God – King, the Eternal, Lord – are all metaphors of specific societies and times that many find inadequate for our day. For most of us, our concepts of God are what we were handed as children. Even if we didn't grow up in a particularly religious family, we pledged faith to "one nation under God" and heard prayer addressed to God at our Girl Scout or Boy Scout meetings or at sporting events we attended.

Questions about God's identity often evoked terms like "mystery." If we concluded that the notion of God was old fashioned and should be put aside, the God we rejected was likely the one we inherited. Join Ron and Rustin for this class as they explore how we imagine God, and what new and traditional language is helpful, appropriate, and/or useful for us to name the Whirlwind.

In the previous course, Ron and Rustin explored who is God. In this course, they will discern who we are as humans in relation to God. "What are Humans, That You Regard Them?" This question comes from Psalm 8:4 and 144:3. Within the Biblical narrative, we see a multitude of answers to this question, many of which seem to compete with one another.

Genesis 1:26 says, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness." Did that experiment go awry, proving God too optimistic? If so, then what are humans "that you care for them?" Do evolution and our altered understandings of who we are, move us further away from God's image or towards it? Join Rustin and Ron and explore the question "What are we as humans?"

In *Parenting Forward*, author Brandt equips Christian parents to model a way of following Jesus that has an outward focus, putting priority on loving others, avoiding judgment, and helping those in need. She shows how parents must work on dismantling their own racial, cultural, gender, economic, and religious biases in order to avoid passing them on to their children. "By becoming aware of the complex ways we participate in systems of inequality or hierarchy," she says, "we begin

to resist systemic injustice ourselves, empower our children, and change our communities." Join us as we learn together how to parent forward together.

Re-imagining some central stories from the religion she knows best, she takes heart in how often God chooses outsiders to teach insiders how out-of-bounds God really is. 


Outdoing Jesus: Seven Ways to Live Out the Promise of Greater Than



Once a week from September 9 - November 11

Did you know you can participate in international mission from the comfort of your own home? E2 is an English Skype program in partnership with a school in Nicaragua supported by Opportunity International, one of WCC's mission partners.

Mastering conversational English helps Nicaraguan students gain skills that will help them find livable wage jobs after graduation. WCC volunteers participate in 30 minute Skype video calls from their home computer, tablet or phone. Volunteers receive sample

questions and conversation ideas in advance of their calls. During the Skype calls, a pair of students present what they have prepared around the conversation topic for the week. When they have finished, volunteers engage in conversation around the weekly topic.

Volunteers do not need to know Spanish and practice with Skype sessions is available before calls begin. Calls take place during the day on Wednesdays and Thursdays during Empredadora's English Classes. Volunteers can sign up to have a weekly call or to become an occasional sub. 
