MICAH: Rote or Required? November 3, 10, 17, 24

"Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with God." Wayzata Community Church has ended nearly every worship service for more than a decade with these words. explored who is God. In this course, they will discern who are we as humans in relation to God. "What are Humans, That You Regard Them?" This question comes from Psalm 8:4 and 144:3. Within the biblical narrative, we see a multitude of answers to this question, many of which seem to compete with one another.

Genesis 1:26 says, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness." Did that experiment go awry, proving God too optimistic? If so, then what are humans "that you care for them?" Toys Are Us: Life Lessons from Toy Story

Central Characters, Toy Story 1:

Andy—the little boy who owns all the toys Woody the Cowboy—Andy's favorite toy Buzz Lightyear—Andy's newest, coolest toy Sid—the bully boy who lives next door Jessie—the Yoedeling Cowgirl

Stinky Pete—the old Prospector
Al—the greedy toy collector
Bullseye—Woody's loyal horse

Other toys–Mr. Potato Head, Rex, Hamm, Slinky Dog, Bo Peep

Synopsis: In a world where toys come to life when no human is watching, a good-hearted cowboy doll named Woody sees his position as his owner Andy's favorite toy jeopardized when Andy gets a Buzz Lightyear action figure for his birthday. Woody, consumed with jealousy and insecurity, tries to get rid of Buzz and in the process they become lost together in the world beyond Andy's

they become lost together in the world beyond Andy's room. They must find a way back to Andy before he and his family move without them, but they will have to set their differences aside and work together to get passed the ruthless toy-killer next door, Sid Phillips.
