## ONLINE WORSHIP 2021

The past year of online ministry has been an incredible learning experience for all of us. Technology has allowed us to stay connected in worship together. As we journey into Lent and Easter, we will continue our innovative approach to Online Worship.

On Sunday mornings, you can watch a service live and also interact with others who are watching. On the home page of our website, when you click the 'Watch Live' button under any of our worship offerings, you will have the option of signing in, or simply watching the service. You will see a live chat bar. In the chat you're welcomed by a WCC host, have an opportunity to say hello to friends, and respond at certain moments in the service. You'll also have an opportunity to receive private prayer 1 on 1 with a staff member.

Our three worship experiences all include scripture, prayer, and a message.

**Parables at 10 a.m.:** A spirit-led service that features inspiring music, messages, and stories from our Parables (special needs/special gifts) community. Led by Autumn and Leslie, Parables is filmed in various locations, and relies on involvement of young adults with special needs.





## OUTDOOR LENTEN PRAYER PILGRIMAGE

**Daily, beginning March 3 through Easter Sunday**

A pilgrimage is a journey experience that invites you to begin in one place and end in a new place. Like any journey it requires the engagement of your body, mind and soul and it is an invitation to journey with God in a new way.

The season of Lent invites us to consider every facet of our lives. It is a time of examining our lives and asking ourselves to take stock of our relationship with God. Lent asks us to lay some things down, to pick new things up, and to release things that are holding us back from a deeper relationship with God.

This Lent, we have designed an Outdoor Prayer Station Pilgrimage for you to experience one time or multiple times throughout the month of March. The Pilgrimage will begin just inside the South doors of the church under the Portico. There you will find a pilgrimage journal that will lead you on a journey around our property. This journey will invite you to pray, read scripture and participate in some sort of action along the way in an effort to experience your Lenten journey in a creative way.

The Lent Pilgrimage is best experienced during daylight hours. The South Doors will be open from 8:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and from 8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. The experience will take you about 30-40 minutes to complete. Wherever you are on your journey, you are welcome.

Wayzata Community Church has a Lenten practice of traveling through this season of the church year in Small Groups. This Lent, our small group material will coincide with our Lenten theme "What Love looks like..." .

You are invited to gather a group of friends, acquaintances or other members at WCC to journey with you during Lent. You can meet with your Community Group, your Koinonia Group, or you can form a new group!

#### **What is a small group and what do they do?**

A small group consists of three or more people who gather at a chosen time each week for four weeks (there will be a 5th week of bonus material too!). You can sign up to receive our weekly email with the small group format and lesson for the week! Form a group, find a time to meet, choose a leader (or rotate leadership each week) and you are off and running!

#### **What does it take to lead a small group?**

Leading a group just means that you agree to gather some people together and get your meetings started. Group members should watch the sermon for the week before they come to small group and have the small group format in front of them as you spend time together.

### INTRODUCTION TO THE FOUR GOSPELS \*

**Led by Rev. Dr. Tony Jones and Rev. Danielle Jones**

The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John form the gravitational center of the entire Bible, since they tell the story of Jesus. As well as complementing each other, they also occasionally contradict one another. They are of different lengths, have different authors, were written at different times, and have different themes. By looking at each individually, we can get a better picture of what they collectively tell us about Jesus and his message.

Rev. Dr. Tony Jones is a theologian and writer. He is a professor at Fuller Theological Seminary, his most recent book is *Did God Kill Jesus?*, and he regularly contributes to the *Star Tribune* outdoors section. Class fee: \$20. Scholarships available.

## **CELEBRATE WHAT'S RIGHT IN THE WORLD \***

**Led by numerous facilitators**

**Wednesdays, April 7 – May 12**

**6:30-8:00 p.m. in Mithun Hall or via Zoom, depending upon Minnesota public health guidelines**

It is easy to overlook the many good things around us when anxious times of divisiveness, intolerance and resentment confront us daily. This six-part series will offer a reassuring antidote through hope, positivity, loving-kindness and empowerment.

The first two sessions will explore Nobel Laureates Desmond Tutu and The Dalai Lama's dialogue captured in *The Book of Joy*. Session 3 will be a viewing and discussion of the TED Talk *What's Good in the World*. Session 4 will highlight the Mayo Clinic's *Guide to Stress Free Living*. Session 5 will focus on the book *Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes Lonely World*, by Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy. The last session explores the importance of play in our lives (Adults too!).

Note that textbooks will not be used, although participants are encouraged to buy those that interest them. However, course materials will be developed and handed out at each session. Also, other than the first two, the sessions will be "stand alone". Thus, participants are welcome to attend all or any. Registration of \$30 dollars covers course materials. ## HIGH SCHOOL TRIP TO COLORADO

### GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION

The Colorado Trip is open to all graduated 12th graders.

Dates: July 17-July 25, 2021

**Cost:** The cost of the trip is \$1,400, which includes airfare, food, and supplies while at Noah's Ark and on trail, lodging, and transportation. There will be a couple of fast food meals beyond that cost, as well as personal clothing and outdoor gear for which participants will be responsible (equipment packing list will be provided).

**Registration:** To secure your spot, register at [wayzatacommunitychurch.org/springregistration](http://wayzatacommunitychurch.org/springregistration) with a \$500 non-refundable deposit by Monday, March 15.

**Payment Deadline:** Final Balance is due June 15th, 2021. Deposit of \$500 due at the time of registration. Three installment payments of \$300 each will be auto-billed on April 15, May 15, and June 15th.

### TRIP ITINERARY

**Day 1, July 17:** We will meet at the MSP airport (mid-morning), and fly to Denver, CO. From there, we will travel to Buena Vista. We will stay that evening at the Noah's Ark base camp.

**Day 2, July 18:** We will spend half the day rock climbing and the other half of the day on a white water rafting trip. We will again spend that evening at Noah's Ark base camp.

**Day 3 - 8, July 19 - July 24:** On trail guided by Noah's Ark staff. Discover Colorado on a backpacking adventure with knowledgeable and engaging guides who join our journey as we climb peaks and descend valleys.

**Day 9, July 25:** We will depart Noah's Ark base camp, traveling by bus to the Denver airport, and flying back to MSP airport (mid-afternoon).

**The trip will be a voyage of personal discovery, a great time to bond with your fellow classmates, and an exploration of some of the most beautiful landscapes you will ever see.**

### ABOUT THE TRIP

The Colorado Trip is an outward bound style experience with a focus on faith development and personal exploration for graduating high school seniors. Every challenge during this adventure in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado is an example of how our faith journey intersects with daily life. While being challenged physically, mentally and spiritually, the trip will give you the opportunity to grow in all of these ways. The trip will be a voyage of personal discovery, a great time to bond with your fellow classmates, and an exploration of some of the most beautiful landscapes you will ever see.

### Who is Noah's Ark?

Noah's Ark is located in Buena Vista, Colorado on the Arkansas River. The company specializes in white water rafting and backcountry adventures. Their professional guides will lead us in wilderness backpacking, rock climbing and white water rafting. Each guide is extensively trained in water rescue, wilderness survival, first aid/CPR, and navigation. The exact plan for each adventure will be developed by Noah's Ark with input and approval by Andy Arola and Katherine Poindexter.

- **Meeting #2** is tentatively set for Wednesday, July 14th— evening TBD. This final meeting is just a few days before our departure. We'll cover last-minute details.

Unified Choir will take place on various Thursdays from 4:30 – 5:00 p.m. and the link will be shared on Facebook.







### NICARAGUA EMPRENDADORA E2 ENGLISH

#### SKYPE PROGRAM \*

New Session running mid-March to early June

Weekdays, during the day

E2 is an English Skype program that pairs WCC members with students at Emprendadora School in Nicaragua. Emprendadora School is a mission project of Opportunity International, one of WCC's mission partners. Mastering conversational English helps Nicaraguan students gain skills that will help them find livable wage jobs after graduation. WCC volunteers participate in 30 minute Skype calls from their home computer, tablet or phone. Volunteers receive sample questions and conversations each week to guide their conversations with students. Volunteers can sign up to have a weekly call or to become an occasional sub. #### DOUGH SKILLS COACHES NEEDED

We are thrilled to share the following update on Dough.

After applications closed on January 5th we had 103 applications filled with good ideas to serve the world. Much thanks to our Publicity Task Force for leading the way!

The 103 applications were meticulously reviewed by the Screening Task Force, a team of WCC members who were trained and read and ranked the applications using three objective criteria: feasibility, compelling plan, and church fit. Much thanks to the Screeners who scored each idea to determine if the idea could work, if the business plan is viable, and to determine how WCC can help!

The top-ranked ideas are now being reviewed by our Navigator Task Force who have agreed to take a deep dive into the best of these projects to help them further develop their plan and to prepare them to pitch to our team of Judges in May.

**This is where our team of Skill Coaches will come in!** We need people who have gifts and expertise in a multitude of areas to use their Monday through Friday vocational experience to help further these good ideas. As a skills coach you will be "on call" to be contacted by one of our Navigators to give some directed help in a specific area where you have expertise.
